The following requirements apply to both submitted summaries and the technical paper. Format Requirements

The summary must be developed in Microsoft Word using 12-pt Cambria font style. Format the page with 1-inch margins at the top, bottom, and sides. To facilitate publication, please limit the body of your summary to 250 words with a title no more than ten words. Avoid using figures, if possible. (The length of the technical paper should be no greater than 4 pages.)

### Title Requirements

#### Paper Title

**Lead author's name (Title, First, MI, Last, Suffix)**

**Additional authors' names**

**Lead author's Organization/Affiliation**

**Lead author's email address**

### Summary Text Requirements

The summary text should include the following:

- The objective of the work being reported
- The relationship of the work to the overall interests of DOE safety analysis
- The results of the work



**IN GENERAL** The abstract must provide sufficient detail to allow the uninformed reader to gain an overall grasp of the work and its relevance to the workshop audience. The content of the abstract will be the basis for evaluation against other submissions. Abstract quality (including clarity, completeness, relevance to the workshop topics, and importance to the safety analysis process) will be the major factor in judging acceptability.
